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#### PRINCIPAL'S COMMENTS

Greetings all and welcome to Week 8.

It is really incredible just how fast time moves, especially at the end of the year. We have only a few more weeks until we finish. Just a reminder that the final day for students is Wednesday 16 th December. It seems like just yesterday we were starting the year now it is almost done.

Our new demountable building will be installed at the end of the car park at the end of L Block during the holidays. We have opted to put the building there rather than next to the library as it provides the best fit for our upper stages. I realise we will have to use the other sites in the future, but this time the site was in the best interest of all. Next year we have a record Kinder intake and we will have four classes beginning school with us. We will be starting 2016 with 449 children at this stage.

## Good for Kids good for life

Tips to Encourage Drinking Water

We all know that water is the best drink for children however sometimes it can be difficult to persuade them to choose water over sugary drinks.

Here are some tips to help encourage water intake:

- Always have water available and accessible e.g. have a jug of water in the fridge or provide bottles of water for outdoor play
- Remove temptation by not storing sugary drinks such as soft drink in the house
- Keeping water cool or using a water filter may better suit your child's taste
- Try flavouring the water with lemon or lime slices.
   You can even add herbs such as mint
- Explain to your child why it is important to stay hydrated and why water is the best choice

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

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## Good for Kids good for life

Recipe: Vietnamese Rice Paper Rolls

INGREDIENTS	QUANTITY
22cm round rice papers	12
Lebanese cucumber	1
Red capsicum	1 small
Carrot	1 large
Avocado	1 small
Coriander leaves	3/4 cup
Mint leaves	3/4 cup
Unsalted peanuts (optional)	55g
Sweet Chilli Sauce	3 Tbsp.
Soy Sauce	1 1/2 Tbsp.
Fresh lime juice	3 Tbsp.



#### METHOD

- Cut the cucumber, capsicum, carrot and avocado into short thin strips and finely chop the peanuts.
   Piace on a platter with the herbs ready to roll
- $2. \ \mbox{Combine}$  the sweet chilli sauce, soy sauce and lime and set aside as the dipping sauce
- Soak a rice paper roll in a bowl of warm water until soft. Place strips of the vegetables and herbs on the wrapper, about 3 cm from the base.
- 4. Fold up the bottom of the wrapper, fold in sides and roll up to enclose the filling. Place on a tray and cover with damp towels. Repeat with remaining rice paper and serve with the dipping sauce.

Tip: you can buy rice paper rolls from Coles. If your family would prefer meat in the rolls you can use strips of beef or BBQ chicken.
