Five Minutes With

5 minutes with our School Administration Manager (SAM) – Cheryl Bornen

Written by Leonie Beazley (parent): A P&C Initiative **Why did you accept the position at BBPS?**

I wanted to be part of the BBPS educational team to support the education of our students. Even though many think of office staff as just the office ladies – administrators are an important part of the school's organisation and do a lot of the work behind-the-scenes, which gives more time for our teachers to focus on their students.

At the interview I was asked how I could implement new systems into the school office, which desperately needed an overhaul. I knew this was my opportunity to help BBPS by improving both the efficiency in the office by instigating new workflow systems and redesigning the office space, which was at the time ineffective for the work the administration team did. My experience in working for the Department of Education since 2000, in a variety of schools: large high schools to small primary schools, helped me gain the skills needed to make a difference at BBPS.

What do you like about being an Office Manager (SAM) at BBPS?

I like making sure students get the best educational support, even though most don't realise that is what I do, I manage educational support from behind-the-scenes, in finance and administration.

My job involves attending meetings with the finance

committee and working with the principal on the budget, overseeing the administration of daily finance processes, such as receipting and banking, to processing orders and payments to pay for all the goods and services the school requires daily.

Another area I manage is Sick Bay, where my first aid training enables me to help students who are sick or have been injured. Sometimes a Band Aid or icepack will do the job, but there are times when I have to call an ambulance when a trip to hospital is required.

What's your fondest memory of being a primary student?

I went to school in Queensland, so my education was somewhat different from the NSW education system. The subject I loved the most was art - being creative was something I looked forward every week. My next favourite subject was maths, and I also enjoyed being part of the annual school concert.

The primary school I went to had more than 1,000 students, which is much larger than BBPS, so I had lots of students in my year, every year. But my fondest memory is that of the friendships that were formed during primary school and all these years later I am still in contact with many of my classmates.

How do you think our school can be improved?

Implementing Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is proving to be a very positive system that is having a positive impact on our students and the school community at BBPS. I am a member of the PBL team and the amount of work that has gone into PBL behind-the-scenes is huge, but totally worthwhile.

I think the school can be improved by minor things that assist with organisation - one area is families sticking to the deadlines on notes for events, such as excursions. Behind-the-scenes there is a lot of work to be organised: the receipting of all the notes, collating the permission that gives us the student numbers to book the buses. Risk assessments need to complete by teachers so that all students are safe when out of the school grounds. Late notes can make a big different in the cost as well, an extra bus due to a change in student numbers can be very expensive, which impacts on the school's budget.

Another aspect that needs to be improved is accurate contact information for parents/caregivers, whether it's a change of mobile phone numbers or someone we can contact if you are not available. We need this so we have someone we can notify in case of an emergency if your child is sick or injured - it is distressing for a child who is in sickbay if we can't get hold of you. Contact details can be updated simply, by dropping into the office, phoning, emailing or by using the Skoolbag app. The school office email is: bonnellsbay-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au

Who is/was your role model?

My parents were my first role models, their family values set my sisters, brother and I up to be responsible, independent and honest adults. Over the years I have had the opportunity to have had many people I would class as inspirational role models, too many to name, but it is good to work with teachers who are showing themselves to be worthy role models for students who will grow up to be the leaders and mentors of tomorrow.


